Carbon Reduction Projects

Valcon have recently collated our 2022 carbon footprint data and implemented a new complete greenhouse gas inventory across Scope 1, 2, and 3 across Valcon Group, in compliance with the Greenhouse Gas Protocol. This will allow us to assess how our organisation's carbon footprint stacks up to industry and regional peers in real-time, and gain insights on setting science-based targets.
